





- 203,718 in 2020



Anderson County Racial Makeup (2020)









Hispanic population has increased 75.8% from 2010 to 2020.




POPULATION DENSITY

Populations in almost every age cohort increased.



Housing by Type, 2020



- 14.7% is considered mobile homes





 Housing vacancies have dropped in Anderson County.





Built Year of Housing


- Most housing in Anderson County was built before 2000.

Note the higher home values surrounding Lake Hartwell.





MEDIAN HOUSEHOLD INCOME (2020)







These parks are strategically distributed across the county, guided by spatial analysis that considers:

- Population density
- Transportation Access






Functional Class

 such as Anderson.




Road Ownership

 minimal congestion






Existing Land Use

 county.




Existing Land Use Map

- Industrial parcels can be seen surrounding Anderson and along Interstate 85.




Parcel Size




Residential Suitability

The areas most suited for residential development are those surrounding the major towns and along the US 76 corridor between Pendleton and Anderson.




Commercial Suitability

The areas around Anderson, Pendleton, and in the extreme north of the county are best suited for commercial development. In addition, the corridors around US Routes 76 and 29, and SC Route 81 are well suited for development.




Industrial Suitability

The areas to the southwest of Anderson, surrounding Pendelton, and along the US 76 corridor are the best suited for industrial development.

 22,491acres of floodplain.




Land Cover

Agriculture

- In 2022, Anderson County had 1,552 farms.
 - Farms covered 174,494 acres
 - The average farm size was 112 acres.
- Farms sold \$8,437,000 worth of products.
 - Hay and miscellaneous crops were the most sold crops, followed by grains and dry beans.
 - Poultry was most commonly sold livestock, followed by cattle.

- 22% of Anderson County is currently zoned.
- Zoning is broken down into 26 zoning districts.


